# **Policy and Procedure on Part-time Students**

## The Vision:

McDonell Area Catholic Schools is the school of choice for an excellent Catholic faith based education within the Chippewa Falls area. We welcome all families to be a part of our school community no matter their faith or financial means. In partnership with our parents, we form the whole child in support of our values and mission. Our vision of the whole child consists of a lifelong learner, who upon graduation, is academically prepared for post-secondary education and career, grounded in relationship with Jesus Christ, balanced physically and emotionally, and actively engages as servant leaders in family, parish, and civic communities.

**Policy** – Reflecting on the Vision for McDonell Area Catholic Schools and recognizing our belief that "parents are the primary educators..." we support enrolling students whose families have determined that although primary, they may not be the best at teaching a particular topic. In those instances we welcome them to enroll their child in class(es) at McDonell Area Catholic Schools. It should be understood that in these instances the student may receive credit(s), but as a part-time student will not receive a diploma.

- 1. A part-time student shall be defined as follows;
  - a. A **High School** student taking **less than 7.0 credits** per year from McDonell Central Catholic High School. Full-time students shall be defined as students taking a minimum of 7.0 credits per year or have approved independent study or senior project work.
  - b. A Middle School student taking less than 3 classes per semester.
  - c. An Elementary School attending school less than four hours per day.
- 2. Tuition and fees must be paid in full before the start of the academic school year. Tuition and fees shall be determined annually by the MACS president in consultation with the Education Commission and Finance Committee. There will be no refunds if the student withdraws at any time after the start of the first day of school.
- 3. Part-time students are not eligible for tuition assistance.
- 4. Part-time students will not be considered for valedictorian, honor roll, academic letters, or included in the class rank.
- 5. Part-time students would not be eligible to participate in High School interscholastic/varsity competitions. Per WIAA policy, in order to be eligible, McDonell Area Catholic High School must provide a student 100% of their academic programming in order to be eligible.
- 6. Participation eligibility in school sponsored extra-curricular activities require joint approval with the teacher and principal. Associated costs for activities are not prorated based on enrollment.
- 7. Part-time enrolled students are held to the same discipline standards as full-time enrolled students and may be removed from the activity if there is a violation.
- 8. Part-time enrolled students and their parents will be held to all NCS policies as outlined in the NCS Parent-Student Handbook. Violations of system/school policies may result in dismissal, a failing grade on their transcript, and no refund of their tuition

**Procedure** – As with any enrollment the family/student should begin the process by meeting first with the Principal and School Counselor to determine their eligibility to the school. This would include a review of transcripts and other documentation as deemed appropriate for the enrollment eligibility decision.

Upon determination that the student is eligible for enrollment the family/student would then meet with the Business Manager to complete the McDonell Area Catholic Schools' Registration and pay the tuition and any fees.

As with any family/student the class fees are based on whether the family is a member of a Supporting Parish or not.

# Part-time fees are based on the following formula;

**Elementary** – Fee is based on a six hour day and days per week that the student is engaged with a teacher(s) times(X) the number of periods per day times (X) the Supporting or non-Supporting Parish tuition.

**Middle School** – Fee is based on the period(s) attending per day and week that the student is present including face to face, classroom labs and/or IGA (study hall) times the Supporting or non-Supporting Parish tuition.

**High School** - Fee is based on the period(s) attending per day and week that the student is present including face to face, classroom labs and/or IGA (study hall) times the Supporting or non-Supporting Parish tuition.

Additional class fees may also apply and are available from the Principal in each school.
