In the coming month, Mrs. Ericksen's 4th grade class will be competing in a math competition through the Catholic Education League. The top three students for each school will receive a certificate. The top school in each division will receive a plaque. The top four students in each division will receive an additional certificate and the top student for each division will also receive a trophy. National awards will also be given when a subject has at least three divisions.

## **<u>Student council (HG)</u>** – Student council announced for grade 3 – 5.

**New Science Curriculum (PhD Science)** - Last summer we purchased a new 3-5 Science curriculum. We have been implementing it the best that we can this year with the limited time built in our schedule for Science (less than an hour a week). We have met with representatives from the company and are looking at scheduling some training for our teachers.

### **Religious Certification - Symbolon 1&2**

All teachers have completed 1 session of either Symbolon 1 or Symbolon 2. Paula Hanson has been a great leader in these sessions and organizing each teachers' yellow folder.

### Love & Logic Conference - November 12

We have 8 teachers attending the conference.
