

light bulbs for \$6. An illuminated blue bulb is a sign of showing support to law enforcement. The project leaders who are communicating with several business people and leaders in our community, are receiving tremendous support and excitement.

Proceeds from the light bulb sale will be donated to the Jason Zunker Memorial Endowment Fund at the Community Foundation of Chippewa County. Officer Zunker was struck by a vehicle and killed in January, 2008 while tending to a truck fire on Hwy 53 north of Chippewa Falls.

The endowment fund was established in his memory, with grants to be used for law enforcement safety programs and projects. Also, established are scholarships for high school graduating students who have either been accepted in the

law enforcement program at CVTC, or have a worthy Chippewa County community project. The students from Northwestern High School, Officer Zunker's alma mater, and a Chippewa County high school qualify for the scholarships.

"I am extremely proud of these kids," said Mary Jacobson '78, MACS Student Ambassador Coordinator. "They are learning so much from this project and seeing first-hand how supportive our community is. They are committed to the project, and I am excited for them to see the blue lights shining around our community."

How it started

In the fall of 2016, the leaders of the MACS Student Ambassadors decided they were ready to take on a new project. They wanted to do something to show support for the local law enforcement, because there had been the recent killing of Officer Glaze in Rusk County, and the negative stories in the media over the last year or so toward the police profession. The student ambassadors met with three local officers, and came up with the idea to sell blue bulbs, and give the officers, especially those working overnight, a visible sign of respect, support and appreciation.

The MACS Student Ambassadors reached out to Chi Hi to see if a student group would like to collaborate on the project. The Chi Hi Apollo students accepted and both groups have been working with the Chippewa Falls PD, Chippewa Co. Sheriff's Dept. and Lake Hallie PD.

The blue light bulbs are a symbol of support to law enforcement nationwide, so this sale supports all law enforcement agency everywhere. The students hope their project will show law enforcement personnel that the people of Chippewa County communities and rural areas appreciate, thank and support their efforts to keep all of us safe.



Senior Samuel Zwickel earns. perfect 36 ACT score, National Merit and Presidental Scholar Semifinialist


McDonell Central Catholic High School Senior Samuel "Sam" Zwickel, son of Tom and Susan Zwickel, has not only scored a perfect ACT score of 36, and earned National Merit Scholar status but has also

been named a U.S Presidental Scholar Semifinalist.

Sam is among the 15 Wisconsin students named semifinalists for the 2017 Presidential Scholars award and one of more than 700 semifinalist in the nation chosen for their academic achievement and other criteria.

Students chosen in May as Presidential Scholars will travel to Washington, D.C., in June, where they will receive a Presidential Scholars medallion at a ceremony sponsored by the White House.

The U.S. Presidential Scholars Program was established in 1964, by executive order of the President, to recognize and honor some of our nation's most distinguished graduating high school seniors. In 1979, the program was extended to recognize students who demonstrate exceptional talent in the visual, creative and performing arts. In 2015, the program was again extended to recognize students who demonstrate ability and accomplishment in career and technical education fields. Each year, up to 161 students are named as Presidential Scholars, one of the nation's highest honors for high school students.





Block Schedule

from the Principal Brian Schulner



McDonell Central Catholic High School has been on the same block schedule for over twenty years. The schedule has allowed students to keep a rigorous pace and be successful in their studies as reflected by ACT scores that are consistently over state averages. The only flaw that became evident to me was with our music department.

Both band and choir meet during the study time that is around the lunch period. Band and choir meet during the same time slot, which puts them in competition with each other. Students who have band or choir don't have a study time where they can access assistance from teachers. I see this type of scheduling arrangement being a deterrent to the music program as some students who wish to receive a full immersion in the arts, can't. There are also students who need time each day to study and seek resources and therefore choose to stay out of music classes.

After discussions with the music department and boosters, teaching staff and parents, we are discussing options to change the format of the block schedule for the 2018-19 school year.

A valiant attempt was made at changing the schedule for the 2017-18 school year. However, a different approach needs to be developed to accommodate all the offerings for our students here at McDonell Central Catholic High School. The MACS Education Commission has given their support in making this change.

Changes students will notice that are being implemented for 2017-18 schedule is an added 10 minutes at the end of the school day, which in turn shortens the school year. Students K-12 will start after Labor Day with the senior class graduating before Memorial Day 2018 and the rest Friday, June 1, 2018.

Financial Report

The 2015 - 2016 fiscal year ended this past June 30, 2016, and MACS finished the year with operating revenues of \$4,156,430 and operating expenses of \$4,135,246. This resulted in a positive operational cash flow of \$21,184 excluding the non-cash depreciation expense. Several revenue categories did experience increases.

The expense categories increased over the prior year by \$181,974. Contributing factors were wages and salaries of \$71,000 and benefits of \$89,000. Restricted Fund revenue covered \$128,000 of the salary and benefit costs for the year. The rising cost of health insurance and employee family childcare credit added to the total benefits.

Scrip sales decreased from \$1.933 million the previous year to sales of \$1.714 million, a 0.1% drop. This resulted in a Scrip profit of \$104,378. Of that amount, \$37,557 was given back to families as tuition credit. This is a great program that has potential for unlimited growth, and is an easy way for everyone to painlessly help MACS, by purchasing Scrip through the school and on the

Benefit Mobile App. Scrip gift cards are perfect for the products and services that you regularly use on a daily basis.

As a school system we are again very fortunate to have such generous support from our parishes, alumni, area businesses and friends, and that we were able to have and use funds previously reserved, and to raise an additional \$1,196,000 for specific restricted purposes.

STUDENT TUITION

As a direct result of the generosity of alumni, parishioners, businesses and friends of the McDonell Area Catholic Schools, we have been able to maintain tuition below national averages. **Tuition** and fees paid by families is 26.2% of the total revenue. The difference between the per-pupil cost and the tuition charged is obtained in many ways. Parish subsidies provide 24%. The remaining 49.8% of the per-pupil cost will come from advancement programs, fundraising activities and other resources.

Families, who belong to a supporting parish and meet the criteria for active supporting parish member, qualify for the supporting parish assisted tuition. Additional financial assistance is available for active parish members based on financial need.





A.C.T. College Test

The A.C.T. test is taken every year by McDonell Central Catholic High School students. The A.C.T. report reflects the achievement of McDonell graduates to the extent to which they are prepared for college-level work. The A.C.T. consists of curriculum-based testing of educational development in English, mathematics, reading and science designed to measure the skills needed for success in first-year college course work. The maximum possible score on the A.C.T. test is 36. The table shows the four-year trend of our students compared to the state and national averages.






