Director of Finance and Facilities Scott Sokup

- Year End Financial Audit work nearing an end, due to DPI on October 15th. Will have some findings this year we will need to address. Most are attributable to being understaffed and training needed for staff.
- Fall Audit, which is a Financial and Internal controls audit and an Enrollment Audit, is November 20th and 2st. Molly will be the lead on the Enrollment audit, Scott on the FIC audit.
- We need to update our 2024-2025 Budget for DPI because we fell short on our enrollment projections. This work is due October 30th.
- We will begin work on determining tuition for next year 2025-2026 Fiscal year, and the teacher salary scale. These are due to the Diocese on 12/18/24, so the Commission will need to approve Tuition and salary scale at their November meeting.
- DOJ mapping Grant Quarterly report due 10/30/2024
- Should have audited 23/24 Fiscal year financials for the November Meeting.

Director of IT Josh McCormick

- Reviewing Staff feedback for our new SIS Facts, so we can determine what adjustments or improvements can be made, and discuss next steps moving forward.
- Completed network and device readiness for online PSAT testing
- A meeting with Marco is scheduled to review our phone system, and to address some common issues
- I have a demo scheduled with Emergent 3 (E3), which is an emergency communication and notification system.
- There are several upcoming non-sporting events that will be live streamed including: Parent Q&A Listening Session, Fall Concerts, and the Veterans Day program.

Director of Advancement Amber Leibrandt

- Our new Enrollment Coordinator, Kayla Duncan, has started and we continue with her onboarding and training. We are excited to have her on our team!
- All Annual Plans for Advancement have been completed, reviewed and approved. This includes Annual Fund, Events, Major Gifts/Capital Campaigns, Planned Giving, and Operations. The Annual Enrollment Plan and Strategic Marketing Plan are completed.
- A. B. McDonell Vision Fund annual mailing has been sent to all alumni, current parents, staff, and community friends. As commission members, please consider supporting the annual fund, it is valuable to be able to list 100% participation from our commission.
- We presented the annual fund and started the soft launch of the renewed planned giving program to the Chippewa Falls Catholic Women's Club on Wednesday, October 10th with good results. The McDonell Future of Hope Alliance currently has 46 members (and counting) who have committed to an estate gift towards the school and 31 members of McDonell Legacy of Hope, who have fulfilled their planned gifts.
- The A.B. McDonell Vision Impact Tours and Reception will be held on Wednesday, October 23rd starting at Holy Ghost at 12:30, moving to St. Charles at 1:30, 2:30 for Notre Dame and McDonell

at a 3:30-5:45 reception at the History Center. Society Members and special guests of McDonell are invited to attend. We offer the commission members an invitation as well.

- We have 24 Corporate Sponsors. Please look for the signs and consider thanking them for supporting our schools.
- The planning for the Alumni Visit for November is moving forward. We will be traveling to the Milwaukee/Madison area to meet with donors one on one and host a gathering with a hosting alum. The focus remains on developing relationships with key alumni and engaging and re-engaging alumni.
- We are currently at 20% of our goal for the annual fund, 108 gifts & 48 donors.
- The Annual Report for the Mack Messenger has been completed. Highlights include: 752 donors raising \$966,271 this includes the sum of all gifts received through donations; annual fund, tuition assistance, memorials, matching employer gifts, in-kind, and restricted gifts. We also recognize our supporting parishes who contributed \$945,737 towards keeping our tuition affordable for parish families.
- We increased our engagement by 55% with the class years between 1980-2020 from the previous year's report, from 35 donors to 54 (60 counting our honorary alumni). This is in part credited to the Alumni Giving Competition. We will be honoring ABMVF donors more specifically in this issue with special icons denoting how many consecutive years a donor has supported the annual fund. 311 Donors contributed 433 Gifts to the A.B. McDonell Vision Fund raising \$512,500. Witness the Difference Pledge payments are also recognized and will help us finish this campaign.
- Major Gifts cultivation continues through our Moves Management tracking and cultivation plan.
- The planning for the MACS Spaghetti Spectacular and Kids Carnival (January 26th) continues and the new Spring Gala Committee (March 29th) has met as well. Both committees are looking for additional volunteers to help with the planning of these important system wide events. Please spread the word!
