- Christms musical performances
 - <u>St. Charles</u> held their annual Christmas performances on Tuesday, Dec. 7. There were two performances; one at 12:30 and the other at 5:30. The program was a wonderful arrangement of songs sung by each grade and small groups. Students also read short pieces of the story of the birth of Jesus as a nativity scene was recreated to conclude the production. Congratulations to our extraordinary music teacher Mrs. Bekka Beaufeaux on composing and directing yet another great performance!
 - <u>Holy Ghost</u> held their performances on Thursday, Dec. 9. The first performance was at 12:30 and the other at 5:30. Their performance consisted of nine musical numbers. Three of them were sung by the entire 3-5 grade student body. Three songs were played by the 5th grade band. Each grade level also performed a song on their own. A wonderful job was done by our students and also by our Band director and Music teacher Ms. Stephanie Solberg!
 - Both afternoon performances at each site were live streamed.
 - Both evening performances had a bake sale of cookies, breads and other baked goods. The proceeds will go to help fund the trip to Madison for our 4th and 5th graders later this spring.
 - Also at each school's performance our K-5 Art teacher Mrs. Beaufeaux displayed some wonderfully creative works of Art by all of our students.
 - All of the shows were well attended by family and friends.

• Advent emphasis in both schools

During the Christmas season it seems easier and easier these days to overlook the true meaning of the season. All of the teachers in our schools have put forth much effort to emphasize to our students the true meaning of the Advent season. Visual displays of violets and purples are seen on bulletin boards. Advent wreaths are commonly seen and we lit each week's candle on the wreath every Monday morning at our Merry Monday assemblies. Our students were immersed with the concept of preparation during these past few weeks.

Community Day

Our last day before Christmas break has traditionally been known as a day where our students are directed towards community service. As part of our activities that we have planned in both schools on Wednesday, Dec. 22, our students will make Christmas cards for the elderly in our community and also for local Veterans.

Hold/Lockdown drills

On Tuesday, Dec. 14, both schools participated in a hold/lockdown drill. Each school initiated a Hold scenario and followed the procedure for about 6-8 minutes. At that time a simulated lockdown situation took place. Both drills were managed well by teachers and staff. A big "thank you" to the law enforcement officers for assisting us with some important practice implementing the policy.

Notre Dame and McDonell Brian Schulner

- We are currently working on our courses and requirements in order to align as a Catholic Liberal Arts Curriculum. Mrs. Huffcutt and I have been working directly with each department in re-writing course descriptions and raising our required class graduation expectations across the board. The two in-service days before Thanksgiving were very productive.
- We have also been working with the staff in switching over to a trimester based scheduling system for the 2022-2023 school year at both the middle and high school. While McDonell High School has been on a "block" schedule for over twenty years which has advantages in regards to accelerating students, a block schedule does have its downfalls in regards to versatility and access to offerings. A trimester schedule offers the same in regards to credits and time in class, but spreads the schedule in 60 minute time periods and gives more class days.
- The middle school is currently on a modified block schedule which allows for more time for English and Mathematics. Our middle school schedule works, but is very full and actually quite rigorous in regards to classes taken in a day and expectations. It also puts students in groupings that stay together all year long. A trimester schedule adds an additional exploratory time and spreads the day for the students. It offers different avenues in order to mix the classes and provide more versatility.
- I have had a number of conversations with staff individually, departmentally and as a whole and the benefits of going trimester is being well received. Ever change has its ups and downs, but we think it's going to be a benefit for our students and staff.

Technology Josh McCormick

- After several months of shipping delays and being backordered, our 9 Promethean Interactive Panels have arrived. The three assigned to the High School/Middle School have been installed, and we have been receiving great feedback from the teachers. We plan to install the boards at St. Charles on Monday 12/13/21, and at Holy Ghost on Tuesday 12/14/21.
- We are moving forward with using EANS funding to purchase 36 more Promethean Interactive Panels. This will provide a new panel for every classroom in all three buildings, and will replace our current fleet of projectors. This is part of our 5 year goal, that has been accelerated utilizing the EANS funding that is available to us.
- We are still working to find the best solution to replace our Main Server. We just finished running a Collector on our network to analyze our network traffic and resources. We will use these results to get an updated proposal from HPE. We hope to have their proposal before Christmas.
- We are currently exploring alternatives to our current streaming service. We currently go through CESA, but it is expensive compared to other vendors.

Advancement Molly Bushman

- Final Phase of Witness the Difference is in full swing. We have obtained some generous pledges and it is not too late for every Education Commission member to make a pledge! Our goal is 100% Education Commission participation. Please email or call me if you can make a pledge.
- Advancement Director position is posted and we are interviewing candidates. Jaynee is still helping with the campaign, events, and will help train in the new person.

- Amanda Empey of Classic Events has agreed to chair the Mardi Gras event committee and plan/run the event for a flat fee.
- We continue to work on developing a comprehensive Ministry of Advancement Plan which we hope to present to Commission within the next couple of months.
