Q: Can you give more details regarding plans for STEM STEM programming details are still up in the air at this point and open for discussion. We will focus on providing fun activities and demonstrations at our Welcome Center that are arts related (readings and projects)
Q: Where can students/community become certified to be a lifeguard Lifeguard certifications are hard to come by at the moment. The best bet is to search local YMCA and Red Cross classes online and see where the closest one is that fits within your schedule. Not this upcoming pool season, but next year (2023), the Recreation Supervisor- Jack Haye plans to become a certified lifeguard instruction. We plan to do our training internally at this point.
Q: What type of partnership are you hoping for from the local schools Our partnership with the schools should be based on collaboration and trying to offer new/exciting programs to the community of Chippewa Falls. Our department is open to new ideas that will help us reach more residents in our area.
Q: Is there an outdoor ice skating rink in Chippewa Falls The Parks and Recreation department will be eager to present our outdoor skating rink sometime in December in Riverfront Park. The rink will be located adjacent to the stage.
Q: How is Parks and Recreation funded Our department is funded through our local government's general tax funding. The City of Chippewa Falls is allocated a certain number of funds base on previous years, money in the budget, capital projects, and the needs of other departments. That's how we base our annual budget. Monetary amounts are also frequently given to our department to help fund events like Christmas Village, Haunted Hill, or Music/Movies at the Riverfront.

			Q: Do you do fundraisers for the park? We usually fundraise for specific events like our Run for the Lights 5K & 1-mile Walk. Sponsorship letters are crafted and given to the community businesses, and they can choose whether or not they want to give to the event/program.

- Teachers received professional development from the University of Dallas on Oct 29th.

 - Using poetry helps in building knowledge and reading skills but it also can help cultivate wisdom and virtue for students
 - Using Socratic questioning, teachers promote independent thinking of their students and give them ownership of what they are learning. It helps to explore ideas, get to the truth, and can check how they are thinking about things
 - Challenge: Is there a way to put energy into separating true assessment from number and letter grades?

• Soles4Souls

Throughout the month of October, our Holy Ghost student council led a shoe drive called "Soles4Souls." Our students in 3rd, 4th and 5th grade were instructed to bring in lightly worn shoes or boots that each class would collect and donate to the cause. The Optimum Therapies organization collected the shoes from the Holy Ghost building on Friday, November 5. The collected footwear will be used to aid in domestic disaster relief and even distributed to countries such as Haiti or Honduras. Our students at Holy Ghost were able to collect and donate 341 pairs of shoes! Many thanks to our students and to Mrs. Sykora for directing the student council to this cause and assisting the group in their efforts.

• 4K - K Soup Supper scheduled

On Thursday, Nov. 18 there is a gathering planned at the St. Charles building that will provide an opportunity for our 4K and current Kindergarten families to mingle and dine together in our annual Soup Supper. The idea of this evening is to encourage our current 4K families to enroll at MACS for Kindergarten for the 2021/22 school year. Our 4K and Kindergarten teachers will be present to answer questions and provide information in their classrooms. The event is scheduled to start at 4:45 and conclude at 6:30. We have over 90 people that have RSVP'd with their intention to attend.

• Spaghetti Spectacular veterans performance

During our annual Spaghetti Spectacular fundraiser, some of our K-5 students will perform at approximately 4:30 on Sunday, November 14. The songs will be dedicated to our local and MACS community veterans. A huge thank you to our music instructors, Mrs. Beaufeaux and Ms. Solberg for organizing and preparing our students to perform that evening.

Notre Dame and McDonell - Brian Schulner

- Congratulations to our Girls Volleyball team on their State Championship! It was exciting for everyone to watch and be a part of.
- We have completed the first quarter of the 21-22 school year. Grades have been posted and the honor roll will be announced soon.
- We hosted the Veteran's Program for our local Veterans last Thursday. A big thank you to everyone who helped put the program together. The Veterans were very complimentary of our efforts and the program was a success.
- We are already in the planning stages for the 22-23 school year. We will be discussing course offerings and scheduling scenarios at our November inservice. We are making great strides in moving towards a Catholic Liberal Arts approach and are studying the benefits of moving to trimester scheduling.
- The senior class trip is a go! A senior parent meeting was held Wednesday November 10th to explain the trip and the financials. The trip will take place the last week of March 2022

LRP - TJ Proue and Fr. Burish

- We have received five submissions for master planning for all parish and school campuses from various architectural firms. We have a meeting on November 17 to select from those proposals and hope to have a start to the Master Planning process this year with a final master plan and case statement completed in time for the diocesan capital campaign.
- The idea behind comprehensive master planning is to ensure that all capital expenditures are planned and scheduled so as to ensure the efficient use of capital resources and avoid conflicting projects and uses within the entire Catholic Community in Chippewa Falls.

Facility - Scott Sokup

- Boiler System at St Charles had some work done on it this fall, replaced the water/condensate tank. According to our usage agreement MACS will be responsible for \$5000.
- FYI, St Charles Parish hall build has been put on hold till Spring due to Winter and timing of some permitting.

Finance - Scott Sokup

- Tuition Committee meeting November 4th, tuition will be presented at the November Meeting
- Revised our application for the Emergency Connectivity Funding added computers that will be reaching the end of life next year.
- Finalized budget for this year. We did not need to do a November revised Choice budget because our enrollment didn't differ by 20 students or 20% from our first budget.
- Fall Audit field work was on November 2nd and 3rd, due to some information delays from DPI they may need to schedule a second field date in November

- Work is starting on the 22/23 Budget, which is due to Commission in December for a preliminary vote.
- EANS funding has to be encumbered by May of 2022, DPI moved the time frame up by 15 months, we are working on proposals.

Technology Josh McCormick

- Our Core Network Switch upgrade project is now complete. This is a big update to the backbone of our network. This upgrade will help improve our network speed, reliability and redundancy.
- Our order of 9 Promethean Interactive Panels have been pushed back with an updated ship date of 11/18. These boards are part of our plan to replace our aging fleet of smartboards and projectors that are showing major signs of wear, and are near their end of life. Our order will provide 3 Interactive Panels to each building.
- We have received quotes for a fleet of Interactive Panels to replace all of the Smart boards in each building, with delayed ship times in mind, our goal is to have them installed by the beginning of the next school year.
- We have received multiple quotes and solutions for a new Primary Server to replace our current aging server that is running out of resources to efficiently run our network. We are narrowing down the options, and making a proposal soon.
