

McDonnell Alumnus Joe Baker ‘06 ordained a priest for the Madison Diocese this past summer

On June 24, 2016 Bishop Robert C. Morlino of Madison ordained Fr. Joseph “Joe” Baker ‘06 to the priesthood at St. Maria Goretti Church in Madison. Father Joe is the most recent alum of McDonnell Central Catholic High School to be ordained to the priesthood.

During the homily at the ordination Bishop Morlino reflected on one of the ordination rites -- the Laying on of Hands. “It’s always been a matter of silence and there’s a very good reason for that and the reason is that we humans, we mortals, should just clam up and let the Holy Spirit at that moment speak actually unspeakable words that only Joe can hear,” Bishop Morlino said. “Nobody else can hear them

and he may not even hear them tonight clearly. But as the days go on, one of the things that he can look forward to is the coming of clarity to the words the Holy Spirit spoke to him in silence tonight.”

Fr. Joe started his undergraduate at UW-Madison where he chose to pursue the priesthood. He continued his studies at Immaculate Heart of Mary seminary in Winona, MN before finishing at the Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C. Fr. Joe concluded his studies at the Pontifical North American College in Rome, Italy for his theology studies where he was ordained a deacon last October.

frozen foods.


What does her future plans include? She answered simply, "Growing older with my husband!!"



This past June-July, John Francis, a junior at McDonell, traveled to Europe to play with the Wisconsin Ambassadors of Music. The group was comprised of 250 talented high school musicians from all over the state of Wisconsin. John auditioned and was selected to play the trumpet in the band, and his mother Laurie Francis also went and played Euphonium. They traveled to London, England; Paris, France; Venice, Italy; Crans-Montana, Switzerland; Seefeld, Austria; and Rothenburg, Germany.

The experience actually began in June, when the entire group met for the first time at UW-Whitewater for camp. After three days of intense rehearsals, the musicians had prepared an extensive collection of repertoire and were ready to perform in Europe. The sixteen day trip was filled with sightseeing of the most famous landmarks in each country; like Buckingham Palace, Notre Dame, the Matterhorn, and the canals of Venice. The 150 piece band performed concerts in parks, villages and medieval town squares.

The 100 member choir had the experience of singing in some of the most famous cathedrals and churches throughout Europe. John summed it up by saying, *"It was an amazing adventure! Traveling like this opens our minds up to people and cultures that are uncommon to our way of life. It encourages us to include the rest of the world in our thinking. I will share the things I learned to my fellow band members in hopes of making them realize there are so many fantastic music experiences available if you set your goals high and never say it's impossible!"*

The Wisconsin High School Powerlifting Association (WHSPA) Raw State Championships were held in Cudahy Wisconsin on July 23, 2016. Despite the heat, three students competed from IRONMACKS.

Raw powerlifting is when a competitor lifts without the benefit of a Squat suit or bench shirt.

In the girls 48 kg class Emily Krause took second with a 57.5 kg squat, 40 kg bench press, and a 67.5 kg deadlift, equalling 126.5 lb squat, 88 lb bench press, and 148.5 deadlift.

In the boys 82.5 kg class, Eric Ohde took third place with a 115 kg squat, a 102.5 kg bench press and a 152.5 kg deadlift equalling 253 lb squat, 225.5 lb bench press and 335.5 lb deadlift.

In the boys 110 kg class, Eric Bromeisl took second place with a 195 kg squat, an 85 kg bench press and a 210 kg deadlift, equalling 429 lb squat, 187 lb bench press and 462 lb deadlift.

All weights are displayed in kilograms in keeping with USAPL standards. USAPL is the United States governing body for the International Powerlifting Federation (IPF).





The McDonell Central Catholic High School is proud to announce the 2016 Distinguished Alumni inducted into the McDonell Hall of Fame. The recipients reflect the mission, vision, and values of the McDonell Area Catholic Schools and have had a positive impact on McDonell Central Catholic High School.

This year the selection committee chose four nominees for athletic achievements and two for outstanding achievement or service to the school or community. These recipients were honored at the Annual Alumni Celebration, which was held on Saturday, April 30, 2016.

Distinguished Athletic:

Joe Scheidler, Class of 1972, was

a versatile athlete, participating in numerous sports. As a sophomore he was part of the football team that won the school's first Central Wisconsin Catholic Conference (CWCC) crown and



played for the Wisconsin Independent School Athletic Association State Title. A year later he quarterbacked the football team that defeated Regis 7-0 for the second straight win over the Ramblers.

Joe won the city tennis title nine years in a row. He was a Little League All Star as a 10, 11 and 12 year old. Joe played on Chippewa Falls most successful Little League Team at that time and reached the District finals in 1966. Joe's pitching and timely hitting led his team to championships in the city high school softball leagues.

In his senior year he was captain of the tennis, basketball and newly formed baseball team.

Joe was also the quarterback of the football team and won 10 letters during his high school career.

Dan Meagher, a teammate and classmate, nominated Joe for this award. Dan wrote these words about Joe, “Joe's contribution to McDonell sports was enormous. Joe was always interested in everyone else and how they did in sports. He did not draw any attention to his excellent play. He was the kind of guy that reached out to everyone so that their “game” would be better.” Joe died of a brain injury on August 31, 1973. He was only 19 years young.

Matt Monarski, Class of 1988, was a multi-sport athlete who was a two year letter winner in Cross Country and a four year letter winner in Track and Field. While at McDonell he ran the 100M, 200M and 400M dashes, 220M and 300M

hurdles, 4x100M and 4x400M relays and long jumped. He was named to the All-Conference track team ten times and is still the CWCC record holder in the long jump. He finished in the top five at the state track meet six times and was state champion in both the Long Jump and 300M hurdles in 1988. He was also a member of the Conference Champion team in 1986, State Runner Up teams in 1985 and 1988 and a member of the 1986 State Champion team. He remains the school record holder in long jump and was the school record holder in the 200M dash and 300M hurdles until recently. He went on to letter in track all four years at the University of St. Thomas and earned “All America” athlete honors. He is currently the Senior Director of Global Marketing for a Medical Device company and lives in a suburb of Minneapolis with his wife (Elizabeth Lindsay, Chi-Hi Class of 1992) and two children, Anna and Johnathan.

Lisa competed at the State level in track and medaled in several events each year. Joe signed with the Green Bay Packers in 2007 where he participated in mini camp, training camp and pre-season as a tight end. Joe then joined the Southeast Australian Basketball League (SEABL) later in 2007. He played center position for the Kilsyth Cobras, a semi-professional team, near Melbourne. He was named All Star 5 in his first two seasons and named the SEABL Most Valuable Player in 2009. Joe then moved to Germany to play professional basketball as a power forward for the Geissen 46ers in the German Professional Basketball League from 2009-2010. In that year, he also married his



What are they doing now?

Kelsey Mullen '07 serves aboard guided missile destroyer in Spain

ROTA, Spain – A 2007 McDonell Central Catholic High School graduate and Chippewa Falls, Wisconsin native is serving in the U.S. Navy aboard the guided missile destroyer, USS Donald Cook.

Petty Officer 2nd Class Kelsey Mullen is a fire controlman aboard the forward-deployed Arleigh Burke-class guided missile destroyer operating out of Rota, Spain. Donald Cook is one of four destroyers home ported in Rota.

A Navy fire controlman is responsible for combat systems power for the ship and a radar system and the console that fires missiles in combat.

"There is always more to learn in my job," said Mullen. "Aegis is an extremely advanced system that has been hugely successful for the Navy. So the fact that I get to work in such a vital portion of our mission is very satisfying."

Commissioned in 1998, the Arleigh Burke-class guided-missile destroyer, Donald Cook, measures approximately 500 feet and is powered by four gas turbines that allow the destroyer to achieve over 30 mph in open seas. It was named in honor of Donald Cook, a Vietnam War prisoner of war who died in captivity.

This ship has been fitted with the Aegis ballistic missile defense (BMD) capability that enables the ship to conduct long-range surveillance, tracking, and engagement of short and medium-range ballistic missiles.

According to Navy officials, destroyers are tactical multi-mission surface combatants capable of conducting anti-air warfare, anti-submarine warfare and anti-surface warfare, as well as humanitarian assistance. Fast, maneuverable, and technically advanced, destroyers provide the required warfighting expertise and operational flexibility to execute any tasking overseas.

Assigned to U.S. 6th Fleet, sailors are on watch throughout the European region and are important assets supporting the European Phased Adaptive Approach to enhance the

security of that area of the world from ballistic missile threats originating in the Middle East.

In addition to Donald Cook, three other BMD capable ships are forward deployed in Rota: USS Porter, USS Carney and USS Ross. Having four destroyers based in Rota gives the U.S. 6th Fleet flexibility to send these ships to a variety of locations for a range of missions, while at the same time providing a large umbrella of protection for European allies.

Approximately 30 officers and 300 enlisted men and women make up the ship's company. Their jobs are highly specialized and keep each part of the cruiser running smoothly, according to Navy officials. The jobs range from washing dishes and preparing meals to maintaining engines and handling weaponry.

"I like our fast paced schedule," said Mullen. "Our time out at sea gives our junior sailors time underway to focus on developing themselves. That makes our crew stronger and more proficient."

Challenging living conditions build strong fellowship among the crew, Navy officials explained. The crew is highly motivated, and quickly adapt to changing conditions. It is a busy life of specialized work, watches, and drills.

As a member of one of the U.S. Navy's most relied upon assets, Mullen explained that she and other Donald Cook sailors know they are part of a legacy that will be last beyond their lifetimes.

"By serving my country on the Donald Cook I know everyone back home doesn't have to worry," added Mullen. "They can feel safe knowing we have people like us out here."


