From the Dean Very Reverend Jesse Burish



Our greatest apostolate is our Catholic schools

You may have heard it said that our Catholic schools are an "apostolate" of our parishes. What exactly is an "apostolate"? According to the Catholic Dictionary, an apostolate is "the work of an apostle, not only of the

first followers of Christ, but of all the faithful who carry on the original mission entrusted by the Savior to the twelve to "make disciples of all nations" (Matthew 28:19)..." As parishes in the Chippewa Falls area, our purpose is to bring people to Christ and provide for their spiritual welfare, particularly through proclaiming the Gospel and administering the sacraments of the Church. Aside from the sacraments, which is the particular work of the clergy, our parish communities as a whole proclaim the Gospel and seek to bring others to Christ in a number of ways. One example of such an apostolate could be the St. Francesca Resource Center, which seeks to bring people to Christ and his Church by first

providing for those with temporal needs as threshold for encountering Christ and His Church.

However, arguably our greatest apostolate is our Catholic schools. I can't think of another work of any one of our parishes that is more fundamentally comprehensive in seeking to bringing others to Christ. Our Catholic schools are "youth ministry" in the fullest sense of the term — in the sense that we are forming our young people, together with their families, academically, physically, and most importantly, spiritually. What could be a more fundamentally important apostolic work for our parishes than this?

In many places around the country, Catholic schools have become more and more disconnected from the parishes that first established them. Many have come to see such schools as a mere financial burden on parishes and would rather see them function on their own. The problem with this approach is that, disconnected from parishes, Catholic schools are more

The MACS Pandemic Committee developed a "Brick to Click" plan to safely return to in-person school while also providing virtual learning capability. This plan involved expanding our 1:1 device program to all grades K-12. With some adjustments as we go, the plan has served us well through the tremendous collective effort of staff, students, and parents. This effort has paid off in a number of ways.

A recent survey of our families found that over 95% feel confident in the academic excellence and Catholic identity provided at MACS. A Catholic faith-based education unites faith and reason, "the two wings on which the human spirit rises to contemplation of the truth." (St. John Paul II) Supported by highly qualified faculty, parent involvement, rigorous curriculum, and intervention services, our students continue to learn at a high level. Our students also continue to shine in the arts, athletics, and servant leadership, with plenty of opportunities for prayer and campus ministry. Finally, our enrollment has grown 14% in the past three years and we expect that to continue. At MACS, we have an uncompromising dedication to excellence and offer it all for the greater glory of God.

I hope you will pay special attention to the message on pages 2 and 3 from our Advancement Director, Jaynee Brannen, inviting you to participate in our Witness the Difference campaign. Your contribution will help ensure the continuation of our mission for years to come. Modern Makeover

In November of 2016, a comprehensive listening session was completed as part of updating the McDonell Area Catholic Schools (MACS) strategic plan. The result was a document to map MACS strategies going forward to 2021.

It was apparent as the strategic plan was assembled that we would need to increase our human capacity with the best talent we could find, provide a safe and appealing learning environment and make sure that MACS continued to be affordable to our current and future families. To that end, it was concluded that MACS needed a capacity campaign and thus the Witness the Difference Capacity Campaign was born.

To accomplish this goal we knew we needed help from not only our area supporters but also from our alumni and friends across the country. We began an outreach program in 2017 traveling to the Fox Valley, Twin Cities Metro, Arizona, Colorado, and Florida to share the good news of what is happening at MACS. MACS' successes include a 14% net 3-year enrollment growth, a greater than 95% teacher retention rate, and an updated leadership team model with an emphasis on "growing our own" leaders. MACS provides and supports innovative learning environments and has a long-range plan for all campuses which includes technology.

Over 95% of our MACS families believe that MACS provides academic excellence and strong Catholic identity and a Christian environment. (October 2020 survey)







Ultramarathon swimming for health and to prove a point

Rose Buchmann, Class of 2013, started swimming when she was eight years old with the Chippewa Falls YMCA swim team. At a very young age, Rose suffered from joint laxity and a lot of musculoskeletal pain. Swimming helped her feel strong and capable. Little did she know how important her faith and swimming would become for her physical and mental health.

At the age of 15, Rose, her mother and five siblings were all diagnosed with Vascular Ehlers-Danlos

disorder that causes chronic pain and a variety of other symptoms. Her orthopedic doctor told her she would never be able to swim competitively again. "Getting back into swimming after being diagnosed was really difficult, and

the community at McDonell and throughout Chippewa Falls provided so much support for me and my family," said Rose. But for this disorder, swimming was perfect for her. It was a very natural thing for her to keep swimming like she had been before the diagnosis. Rose worked hard on her physical therapy and set out to prove her doctor wrong. Rose said, "My faith played a huge role in believing that there was more to the suffering and pain."

Except for the one swimming season Rose missed because

of VEDS, she continued through the end of high school swimming competitively for the McDonell/Chi-Hi women's swim team achieving MVP each of the years she swam.

After graduation from McDonell Central Catholic High School, Rose was accepted to the Milwaukee School of Engineering, which didn't have a pool or a swim team, so she wasn't able to swim like she did while living in Chippewa Falls. She graduated with a Bachelors of Science degree in

> Biomedical Engineering in 2017 and went on to Cornell University for graduate school in the summer that same year. There she started swimming laps for exercise, and the summer of 2019 she decided to try open water swimming since the pool hours were reduced and Cayuga Lake is less than 10 minutes from her house. "I really loved it, and I tried my first

open water race in June 2019, which was 1.4 miles across the Potomac River." In August 2019, she swam 1.5 miles in the Milwaukee River for the Cream City Classic. Rose went on to say, "I was enjoying getting back into racing, so I signed up for the Welland 15km UltraSwim in Ontario in September which took 4 hours 25 minutes, and less than two weeks later, I won the Finger Lakes Open Water Swim Festival 10 mile race in Seneca in 5 hours 4 minutes."

Though the races Rose signed up for during the summer

of 2020 were all canceled because of COVID-19, she was notified that New York Open Water was allowing some swimmers to swim the 20 bridges circumnavigation of Manhattan, so just 10 weeks before September 1, the latest race date they offered, Rose started training again after four months off. "I did all my training swims in the lakes surrounding Ithaca which was a really fun experience!" Rose met a lot of other swimmers who were transitioning to open water because the pools were closed.

In open water swimming, Rose has been able to find many of the things she loved about swimming with the McDonell/Chi-Hi swim team, like exciting competitions & long-lasting friendships. "I am really grateful I was able to experience competitive swimming growing up in Chippewa so that I have this interesting aspect to my life now that helps me stay strong and healthy. It also helps a lot dealing with the stress of grad school!"

Rose swam around Manhattan on September 1, 2020. It was current-assisted, meaning she swam in the direction of the current. "I got a push the whole 28.5 miles." She swam counter-clockwise and started and finished at Battery Park. The route took her up the East River, east to west in the Harlem River, and down the Hudson River. It took her 8 hours 11 minutes and 53 seconds.

Rose concluded, "Now, more than ever, I have relied on my faith to push myself to learn and grow as a human and as an endurance athlete. I am so thankful that I am able to continue to swim, and I think this is just the beginning of a long journey of ultramarathon swimming and proving how capable I am."

What water feats are in Rose's future?

June 19, 2021, Rose will be swimming in the END-WET race in North Dakota (36 miles, current assisted). She is also considering an attempt to swim Cayuga Lake which is 34.6 miles (the course record is over 20 hours, she is hoping to go under that to set a new record).

Eventually, she would love to attempt the English Channel and Catalina Channel. These swims plus the Manhattan Island swim make up the "Triple Crown of Open Water Swimming" – basically the three big international swims.

Photographer Nathaniel Johnston works with New York Open Water to provide support kayaking for swimmers during the event. He said, "Rose just KILLED her swim around Manhattan! As always, it's an honor to be kayak support for an awesome athlete on such an epic adventure."



EDUCATION COMMISSION

Dear MACS family of parents, supporters and alumni,

I want to personally thank each of you for your support and patience in this past year. The members of the Education Commission, including myself, have been and will continue to keep the best interests of our children, our staff, parents, and our entire MACS family as our foremost priority.

It goes without saying that balancing the educational needs of our children with the public health risk is no simple task. Certainly, there have been no easy answers and no simple decisions. Even within the Commission and the Pandemic Steering Committee established by the Commission, we have not always all agreed on the best answer. However, we have worked together to do our very best to balance those needs and continue to serve our mission. I am proud that the many individuals involved in this planning process have been able to transcend the politics that have divisively infiltrated these discussions elsewhere and debate proposed action plans in a spirited yet respectful manner so as to achieve a purposeful balancing of the weighty considerations at play.

I thank all the members of the Commission and Pandemic Steering Committee for their extra time and flexibility this year in meeting, sometimes on short notice, to work toward plans which have allowed our school to stay open for the better part of this school year while keeping our children, staff, and families as safe as possible. I also commend President Molly Bushman, and the entire MACS leadership and staff for all the extra hours that have been put into this school year so far. It does not go unnoticed.

While some may not have agreed with all steps taken or plans implemented, it is my hope that you understand that you were heard and every effort was made to balance differing viewpoints, educational needs, risk mitigation, and the other emotional and health needs of our students, staff, and families.

On a most hopeful note, last year the Education Commission formed the Long Range Planning Committee for the purpose of examining our current facilities and begin planning for the future of our school system. In the early discussions of this Committee and in collaboration with our parish priests, MACS joined the city parishes in retaining Meitler Consulting for the purposes of creating a city-wide Pastoral Plan encompassing broad aspects of Catholic life in Chippewa Falls, from the educational needs of our children, to parish ministries, to the details of finance and facilities.

I am encouraged by the attention this project has received from our parish and school families and the level of participation so far. We have, to date, had hundreds of households contribute feedback to this project and we are grateful for the feedback you have given. You can read more about the project on the MACS website at **bit.ly/meitler** and view the key findings.

My prayer for each of you is for your continued safety and peace for the remainder of this school year and into the summer.

My name is Ann David, and I am a senior at McDonell Central Catholic High School. I have attended the McDonell Area Catholic Schools system since I was in kindergarten, and I attend St. Raymond of Peñafort Parish in Fall Creek, Wisconsin. The MACS system has provided me, and every student in its classrooms, the tools and education required to succeed in further education and in the workforce.

While many school systems boast of their students' excellent academic track records, the success of students at MACS speaks for itself. Advanced classes taught by experienced teachers prepare students, both academically and socially, to both learn at a higher level and to work with other students and staff in a professional manner. Teachers value each individual and go above and beyond the usual effort to make sure subjects are understood, not just memorized. For example, this winter I was struggling with having my classes online and having shortened class time with my teachers. My teachers made a point to be available to answer my questions and concerns and helped me get through the material and difficult concepts. While some of my friends at other schools felt deserted by their teachers during virtual learning, I knew my teachers were there for me, and will be there, whether I have classes at home or at school.



While the health and safety of students and staff in the MACS system was the main focus during COVID-19, the administration encouraged healthy living and emphasized that healthy students make smarter students. Over 70 percent of eligible students participate in sports, which leads not only to exercise, but to teamwork that extends far beyond the playing field. Through sports, I have made many strong friendships and participated in experiences I will remember for the rest of my life. I would like to especially thank all the coaches and parents who give their time and energy to cultivating student-athletes. They know the value of learning is just as important as being a starter at the next basketball game.

The MACS system is special to me because it has not only academically prepared me for my future, but has also spiritually prepared me. Through all my years at MACS, I've come to understand the religion that my parents chose for me, and that I now choose for myself. Prayer is a critical part of every school day, with the day beginning with morning prayer and breaking at noon to pray the Angelus. Religion classes dive into the intricacies of the Catholic faith. The chapel, the heart of McDonell High School, is a beautiful example of what is valued the most at MACS: faith. With continued support from the MACS community, the schools in the MACS system continue to exemplify the best choice for a Catholic education in the Chippewa Valley.

MACS had an average tuition increase of 3.7% for the 2020-21 fiscal year. However, the net increase seen by many families was closer to 2%, because we eliminated a technology fee and some other fees as part of our strategy to reduce fees.

Thank you to all alumni, parishioners and businesses that supported MACS in 2019-20. Your generosity has enabled MACS to keep tuition affordable.

Families who belong to a supporting parish and meet the criteria for active supporting parish member qualify for the supporting parish assisted tuition. Financial assistance is available for active parish members based on need. MACS participates in the Wisconsin Parental Choice Program and the Special Needs Scholarship Program.

Finance Reports Charts

The pie charts (left) show what was received and expensed in the various categories for the year 2019-2020. MACS finished the year with operating revenues of \$4,494,693 and operating expenses of \$4,756,385. This resulted in an operation loss of \$261,692 excluding the non-cash depreciation expense.

COVID restrictions impacted both the Revenue and Expense side. Revenues dropped in Scrip, athletics, childcare and food service. Expenses increased in administrative, instructional and wages.

Scrip Gift Card Sales

Sales were \$1,448,355 for the 2018-19 fiscal year. Total Scrip profit amounted to \$63,901, of which \$27,135 was allocated to school families helping with their tuition.

Scrip gift cards are a fund raising program where anyone can purchase the over 80 different local and national business gift cards we have on hand in our MACS Central Office. Thank you to the businesses who participate in this win/win program!

Finance Committee

The Finance Committee works to ensure that MACS is strategic about resource management in order to ensure quality education and a safe environment for the long term. Committee members are appointed by their parish. The committee meets monthly to review financial results, the budget and investments. In addition they discuss news and trends that may impact Catholic Education. Committee members include the parish representatives and the President, Controller and Business Manager at MACS.


