Principal Reports

St Charles Grades 3K-2 - Principal Mrs Jamie Dodge:

Review:

- We had our first Mission Day and we helped Support our Troops. We had so many non-perishable items donated that it took 2 car loads to get it over to McDonell.
- Ignite the Light has been going so well and the kids are enjoying learning about God through science.
- St. Charles did a Veterans concert on November 11th for Veterans and Parents. It was very beautiful and was a great way to thank all of the veterans and those currently serving.
- A local author came in and read her book, "Ostriches Eat Sausages: An Alphabet Book" at the 4K literacy night. We had pizza and the students created their picture to take home.
- 4K and Kindergarten had their first adoration with Father Kren. It went pretty well and the students are learning about being present with God.

Current

• 1st and 2nd grade students had their first adoration with Monsignor. They were so respectful and participated. The teachers have been talking about adoration in the classroom. Monsignor also met with them early in the month and talked about what adoration is and what it looks like.
