With spring on the horizon, the IT Department is in full swing wrapping up the school year and preparing for the next. We are currently preparing for the Student Assessments. Most tests are Mr. Josh McCormick completed with Chromebooks online. We are performing network

evaluations to make sure our network is ready, and

making sure Chromebooks are up to date with the proper applications to run the tests. The middle school and high school Promethean boards arrived mid March, so we have begun installing them into the classrooms. This is a very exciting project that will help teachers with classroom instruction. The majority of classroom projectors are near the end of life, and as the year progresses, more have started failing and started to degrade. We have begun preparing for the next school year by starting the review process of student Chromebooks and teaching devices. We have a large quantity of student Chromebooks that are scheduled to be replaced that are near their expiration date, and have seen many years of wear and tear. Teachers' laptops are also due to be replaced. In the world of technology they are considered quite old and outdated. New, updated laptops will improve speed, performance and reliability in the classroom, so technology can continue to be an aide in the classroom, rather than a hindrance or a disruption when issues arise.







SPRING IS IN THE AIR!




Third grade art class learned how to make origami (above). The two most important folds and the simplest are the valley fold and the mountain fold. They form the foundation of all origami models.



Restorative Justice - Healing the Harm Thursday April 7th 7:00 - 8:30 pm CST on Zoom

The Virtual presentation will also be available for viewing at Holy Ghost Church located at 412 S Main St, Chippewa Falls.

As defined by UW Madison Law School, **Restorative Justice** seeks to examine the harmful impact of a crime and then determines what can be done to repair that harm while holding the person who caused it accountable for his or her actions. Accountability for the offender means accepting responsibility and acting to repair the harm done.



Father Daniel Griffith, a priest of the Archdiocese of St. Paul and Minneapolis, was ordained in 2002. The youngest of nine children, Griffith grew up in Northeastern Wisconsin and is an avid golfer and sports fan who enjoys music, travel, and cooking. Fr. Griffith joined the University of St. Thomas School of Law faculty in 2011 and currently serves as the Wenger Family Faculty Fellow of Law. At St. Thomas Law, Griffith teaches courses in Catholic Thought, Law, and Policy, Jurisprudence, and Restorative Justice, Law, and Healing. Fr. Griffith is the founding director of the Initiative on Restorative Justice and Healing (IRJH) which launched in fall of 2021. Rooted in the Catholic intellectual tradition, IRJH seeks to respond to harm that occurs from leadership and institutional failures, racial injustice, and polarization in a way that promotes accountability and healing.



WISCONSIN PARENTAL CHOICE PROGRAM



WHAT IS THE WISCONSIN SCHOOL CHOICE PROGRAM?

The state of Wisconsin has a program that allows eligible students to attend a participating private school in grades K-12. The private school, on behalf of the student's parents and guardian, receives a state aid payment for each eligible student.



HOW IS A STUDENT ELIGIBLE?

Student eligibility is based on a combination of student residency, income and age. Students from a public school may apply for any grade. All families must provide documentation that they live in the state of Wisconsin. Acceptable documentation may include a utility bill, W-2, or property tax bill.



WHAT IS THE INCOME REQUIREMENT?

The state of Wisconsin determines the income limit at 220% of the federal poverty level. Parents must enter their adjusted gross income from their federal tax return and provide a copy of their current year taxes to the school system.

HOW DO I APPLY?

Each year, families can apply at **dpi.wi.gov/choice**. The application period is February – April. Current Choice families are required to re-apply.
