St. Francis

One of October's prominent feast days is October 4, the feast day of St. Francis of Assisi, perhaps the most popular Catholic saint of all time. At the end of September, I'll find myself on a trip to Rome (please pray for me!), and, as October begins, I am actually going to be in Assisi, Italy, Francis' hometown, where he spent the

majority of his life and where he is buried. Assisi is a tranquil, medieval town, rife with tourists and pilgrims. It isn't very large, but the whole reason it attracts so many travelers each year is its most famous citizen, St. Francis, who died nearly 800 years ago. If it weren't for Francis, you and I probably would never have heard of the little town of Assisi.

I think it's fascinating that Francis chose to live the rest of his life in his little hometown. Although he did travel quite a bit after his conversion (including walking hundreds of miles on foot to Rome to speak to the pope and then to Egypt to try to convert the Muslim sultan there), he allowed Jesus to change his life in the place where Christ first encountered him. I think there's a certain wisdom in that. Often we feel that we need to go places to become great and holy people. It's true that God can work through things such as pilgrimages to draw us closer to Him, but Jesus does not need us to go anywhere to make us holy. In fact, He often wants us to stay in the very places He finds us and to seek holiness there, rather than dreaming of becoming holy somewhere else.

May St. Francis' example encourage us to find holiness here in Chippewa Falls, of all places. Who knows? Maybe one day our little town will be known around the world for the holy life of one of us.

The IT Department had a busy summer preparing for this school year. We ordered, and deployed roughly 200 new student Chromebooks. A majority of our Chromebook fleet reached their end of

Mr. Josh McCormick life after the school year, and were due for replacements. We also upgraded our

firewall which allowed us to increase our outside network connection from 1GB to 10GB. The new firewall will help keep our network secure as cyber threats continue to climb. The upgraded network connection will significantly increase network speeds, and will be able to better handle the increasing network devices. New teacher laptops were also ordered for the new school year. Many of the old teacher laptops were quite old and their performance kept degrading. The new laptops are faster and will solve many of the issues teachers face while integrating technology in their classroom, and create less classroom interruptions. Another very exciting update is that our new server has been ordered and delivered. Our current server is over 10 years old and is running out of resources to efficiently run our network. Our new server will provide much more storage and computing power, along with having built in failover and redundancy. We would also like to remind families that we have Verizon hotspots available to families who don't have internet at home, so students can keep up with their homework. If you feel like you could benefit from a hotspot, please contact the IT department. We are very excited with all of the updates over the summer and our projects planned for this school year to keep MACS up to date with the latest technology!

SCHOOL COUNSELOR NEWS

SENIOR COLLEGE APPLICATIONS

Colleges/Universities/Tech Programs have begun accepting applications for admission. The earlier you apply, the sooner you will receive your acceptance letter and be able to move on to other senior year tasks. Do not delay applying. Instead, **APPLY NOW!!!**

Most schools strongly prefer that you use their online applications. You can find the application links at each individual college website. The site for applications for all University of Wisconsin schools is <u>https://</u> <u>apply.wisconsin.edu</u>. Students can also use the CommonApp as a way to apply to many universities and colleges that are both in and out of state <u>https://</u>

www.commonapp.org/. While some private colleges have free applications, other colleges have separate fees.

After you submit your application, request to have your high school transcript sent to each college using this link <u>https://www.mcdonellareacatholicschools.org/alumni/</u>request-transcript.cfm. Transcripts can be sent in person or via email. The transcript includes all grades and credits earned in grades 9–11. Some colleges may also request your ACT scores.

ACT

If you plan to take the ACT on the December 10th test date, you will need to register by November 4th to avoid the late fee. Be sure to list the McDonell code (500 402) so we get your scores. You can and should apply to colleges now. By doing this, the colleges you send your scores to will create a file for you and add to it as they receive your scores. **Do what you can to keep the application process moving.**

SCHOLARSHIPS

A list of scholarships and their due dates can be found on the McDonell website. (Under *Students - click the Senior Scholarships tab.*) The link is provided here: <u>http://</u> <u>schoolcounselingmacs.weebly.com/scholarships.html</u>

Periodically check the Senior Scholarship page and pay attention to the due dates as you will have opportunities to apply for many scholarships throughout the school year. Many of the local scholarships, which McDonell students earn, become available during the first trimester.

All students should also perform an individualized scholarship search through services such as Fastweb (<u>www.fastweb.com</u>). Fastweb asks questions about you. Using the data you provide, they will inform you of scholarships that you are qualified to receive.

All students should contact the financial aid office at their college to find out about scholarships available to students at each school.

You can't receive scholarships that you don't apply for, so continue working hard! It will pay off!

WI Education Fair (WEF)

Wednesday, September 21st

Junior students were invited to sign up and attend the Wisconsin Education Fair which was held on September 21st at the L.E. Phillips YMCA Sports Center in Eau Claire. Over 100 representatives from various colleges, universities, trade schools, and the military were available to meet with our students and provide them with information on post-high school opportunities!

Financial Aid

ALL FAMILIES should complete the free application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) in order to determine eligibility for many scholarships, grants, and student loans. The FAFSA should be submitted as soon as possible after October 1, 2022.

There is an online application at <u>www.fafsa.ed.gov</u>. (**DO NOT** go to <u>fafsa.com</u>, as that site will charge you at least \$80 for what should be a free application.)

If you are not familiar with the FAFSA process, go to <u>www.studentaid.gov/h/apply-for-aid</u> prior to January to find out what information you will need to submit. There will also be a **FAFSA Parent/Student Information Night** here at McDonell on **November 16th at 5:30pm**. Please keep this date on your calendar and there will be more information to follow.

Juniors PSAT/NMSQT - October 12

A number of our Junior students are taking the PSAT/ NMSQT exam on Wednesday, October 12th! By taking the exam and scoring well, students have the potential to qualify for the National Merit Scholarship. Also, college and career readiness benchmarks are included in the reporting portion of the assessment, as a means to help these students understand their readiness for college and career training programs.
