

MACS on the move

May is a time of transition here for many people, including yours truly. Let me give you a few updates and then close with some thank yous. Once again, we will be working on network updates this summer working on our main data closet and improving our resilience and redundancy.

Summer Update: With the help of eRate funding, MACS is updating it's main data closet while preparing for a more robust server backup and reliability. We are also in various stages of two major projects to replace our aging fleet of interactive whiteboards and our primary servers.

IT Changes: July 1, I am transitioning to a new role as an IT Consultant/Media Coordinator. Logan Mittelstadt will be taking over as the IT Coordinator with ongoing assistance from Josh McCormick. More on my new role to come.

My focus here was to improve the network, hardware reliability, continue with staff engagement and support the mission and vision. The 1:1 initiative we began 7 years ago is now complete K-12 with over 500 devices (iPads K-2 and Chromebooks 3-12.) We also have expanded our wireless devices from less than 20 access points campus wide, to now more than 100. Other major projects included revamping the print support and our current projects to replace all our interactive whiteboards and primary and secondary servers.

Finally, some thanks: When I came to MACS as the IT Director, I felt it important to engage willing veteran teachers in all of our buildings to become lead teachers with technology integration and to serve in an advisory role. To their credit, they always stepped up. I want to thank our Media and Technology committee members -- especially retiring members Cindy Yohnk and Tony Reiter. They were always there to help lead in our efforts. And a thank you to our student members - especially senior Peter Herron '21. And lastly, I want to acknowledge Cathy Greenseth. She has been behind the public image of MACS for a number of years and as I sought to increase the virtual face of McDonell through additional streams of performances, graduations, Mass and sporting events, she has always been there in her capacity as PR Director to advise or assist or to improve. Thank you.

I look forward to my new role in the MACS system.







Fifth grade band performs for fourth grade students and families



Fauvism is the name applied to the work produced by a group of artists (which included Henri Matisse and Andre Derain) from around 1905 to 1910. This art is characterized by strong colors and fierce brushwork. On a nice sunny day, the students were able to go outside to paint in nature, much like these artists did in the summer of 1905 in the French countryside.

Institutional Abuse & Betrayal

Victims of clergy abuse are not only traumatized by their abusers but also the institutions they represent. Our presenter Fr. Matthew Malek, OFM Conv, will lead us through understanding the impacts of spiritual abuse and institutional betrayal which affects all members of the faith community. He will encourage us work together towards institutional courage, to create an environment where healing is possible.



Fr. Matthew J. Malek, OFM Conv., was ordained as a Conventual Franciscan priest for the Archdiocese of Indianapolis in 2013. He received his Masters of Divinity from the Washington Theological Union. He relocated to Minneapolis, MN, to serve as a priest for the Archdiocese of St Paul-Minneapolis and to pursue a Master of Counseling Psychology at St. Mary's University of Minnesota. Fr. Matthew completed his counseling training in 2019 and works as an associate therapist for a local agency. He states that he has "a vocation within a vocation," combining spirituality and psychology to help people heal their wounds.



Paula Kaempffer, survivor of clergy sexual abuse she suffered as an adult working in the Church, knows firsthand about the kind of betrayal that can take place, but also what healing can take place. Paula is the outreach coordinator for restorative justice and abuse prevention for the Archdiocese of St. Paul and Minneapolis, she said healing "takes a lot of personal work" and "a lot of inner strength to recapture the power that has been taken away from you." She said she is grateful that she has done that work and "come out on the other side."



What to Do When You Think You Aren't a *Good Enough* Parent

Parenting is hard work. It is not easy to embrace parenthood and stick it out. That is why a group of parents asked me to join them in a discussion about parenting. They wanted me to listen to their situations and offer some ideas for hope. A mom talked about her head-strong son who questioned every decision and request she made. A father described his daughter who had become an accomplished liar. Another mother shared concern about her timid daughter who struggled to stand up for herself. Another parent disclosed how her son's independence was leading him to detach from the family and its guidance.



As the conversation developed, I was struck by several common threads that ran through each of the parent's concerns. All of them wanted their children to succeed in life. Each of them wanted their son or daughter to do their best. Yet, all of them felt insecure about their ability to support and guide their children. None of them felt they were prepared to face the challenges of parenting a child into adulthood. As one parent succinctly put it; "I just don't feel like I am a *good enough* parent."

This feeling of being inadequate took me back to the time when my children were becoming adults. I also worried about raising children to be happy, healthy, and holy adults. I doubted my ability to be the first and best example for my kids. It was so easy to question my actions and motivations back then; so tempting to feel that I couldn't be the parent I needed to be. It was tempting to feel like I should abdicate my parental authority to another adult or institution or let my kids go it alone.

Thankfully, I never gave in to the negative emotions tugging at my heart back then. I resisted the voices trying to convince me to give up; to settle on being *just good enough*. Gratefully, I chose to acquire the virtue of **fortitude** and tackle parenting head-on.

When the parents in this small group asked me to comment, it was a privilege to acknowledge their emotions and struggles and offer fortitude as a solution to their parenting struggles. I shared that fortitude is a foundational moral virtue which ensures firmness in difficulties and constancy in doing what is right and good. It is mental and emotional strength to face doubt or temptation courageously. Fortitude helps you overcome emotions like fear and despair; feelings that make you think you are lacking and not worthy to be a wonderful parent who can guide and lead.

Making fortitude the center of the discussion shifted the group's focus from worry to hope. We discussed how moral courage is needed to face struggles and move forward. We talked about fortitude as a way to push outside of your comfort zone and act intentionally. We explored how fortitude confronts personal

weaknesses and the feeling to give up. Most importantly, we discussed that fortitude makes it possible to do what is best – especially when it will cause you suffering.

Through the discussion, the parents came to a collective understanding that parents – ALL parents – struggle. Each mom and dad is challenged. Each parent worries. As one father put it, “pick your hard. It is hard to parent. It is hard not to parent. So, pick your hard.” His comment made the group see that building fortitude was the reasonable way to shoulder the hard burden and increase parental hope.

Developing any virtue takes time, effort, and a lot of grace from God. Maturing in fortitude is nearly impossible without divine assistance. With God’s help, parents can stop feeling sorry for themselves, learn to control their anger and anxiety, and resist the impulse to make everyone happy. They can set and implement boundaries and standards for behavior. Under God’s care, parents can learn from their mistakes and plan for a better future. Filled with the grace and mercy of God, parents can renounce misgivings and embrace sacrifice for the sake of the child. Here is a prayer to help you build fortitude.

*Dear God, help me to develop fortitude,
for it is something that I lack.*

*I need courage to raise my child/ren
to know, love, and serve you above everything and everyone else.*

*I need courage to fight against my doubts,
against worries and troubles, temptations,
attractions, darkness and false lights,
against tears, depression, and above all fear.*

*I need fortitude, dear God.
Strengthen me with Your love and Your grace.*

*Console me with Your blessed Presence
and grant me the courage to persevere
and know that I am the best parent for my children.*
